 - Our group in the Academies is just completing a large scale study of the nation's \$2.3 billion SBIR program
 - The Small Business Innovation Research program (SBIR) was found to be “sound in concept and effective in practice.”

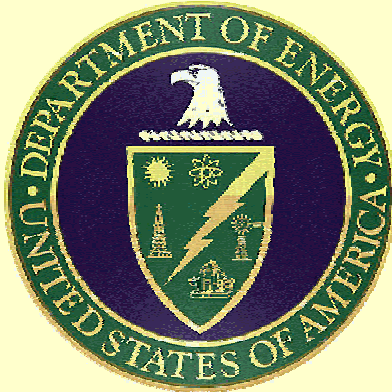
Today's Conference: 'Financing Solar in Hard Times'
