


25 YEARS AGO

- Currently in San Diego, one new technology-based company is created every day.

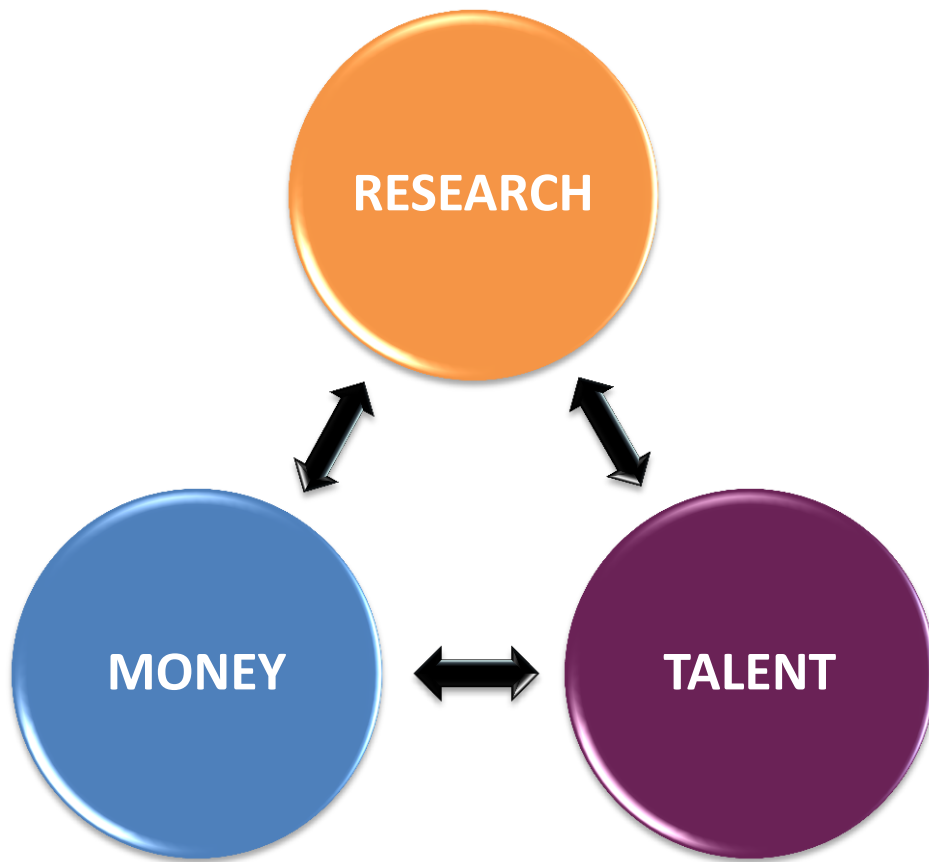

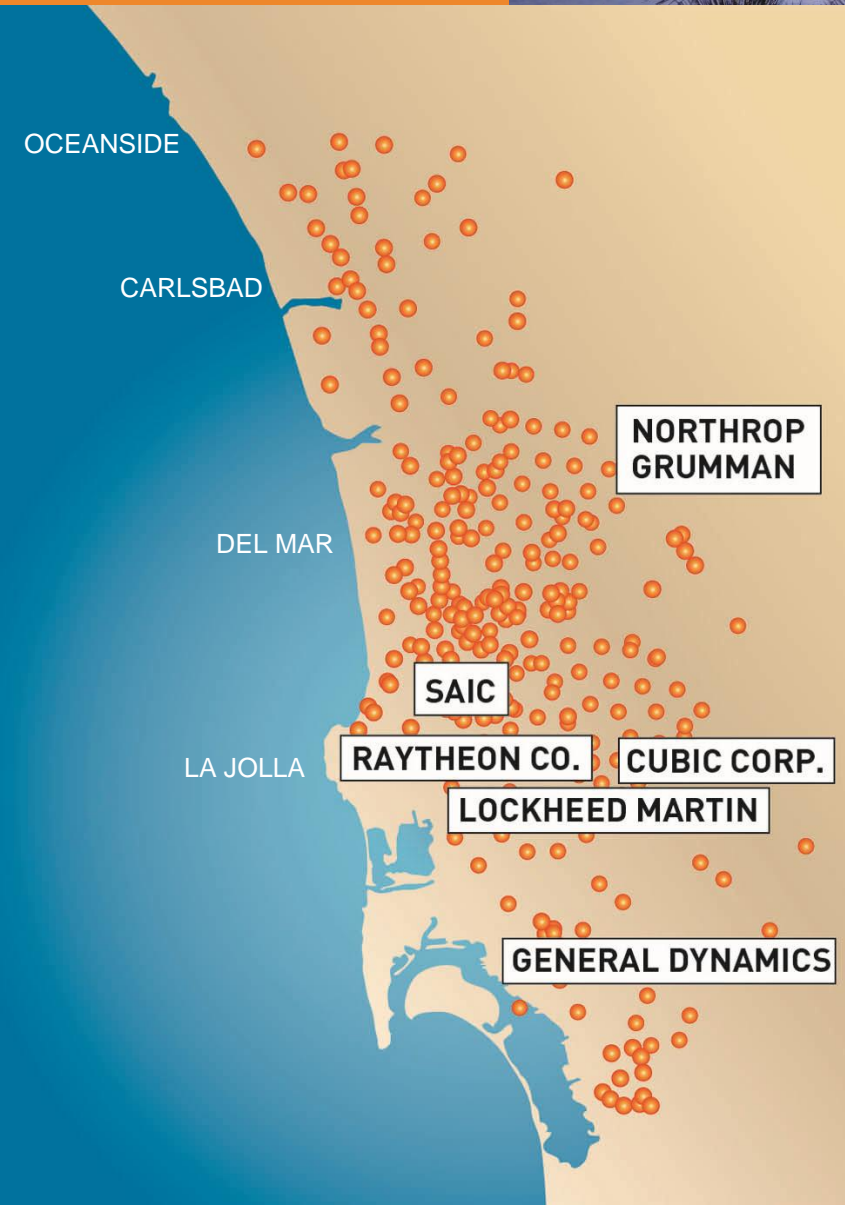

Ruben H. Fleet opened the **Consolidated Aircraft** plant in San Diego in 1935.

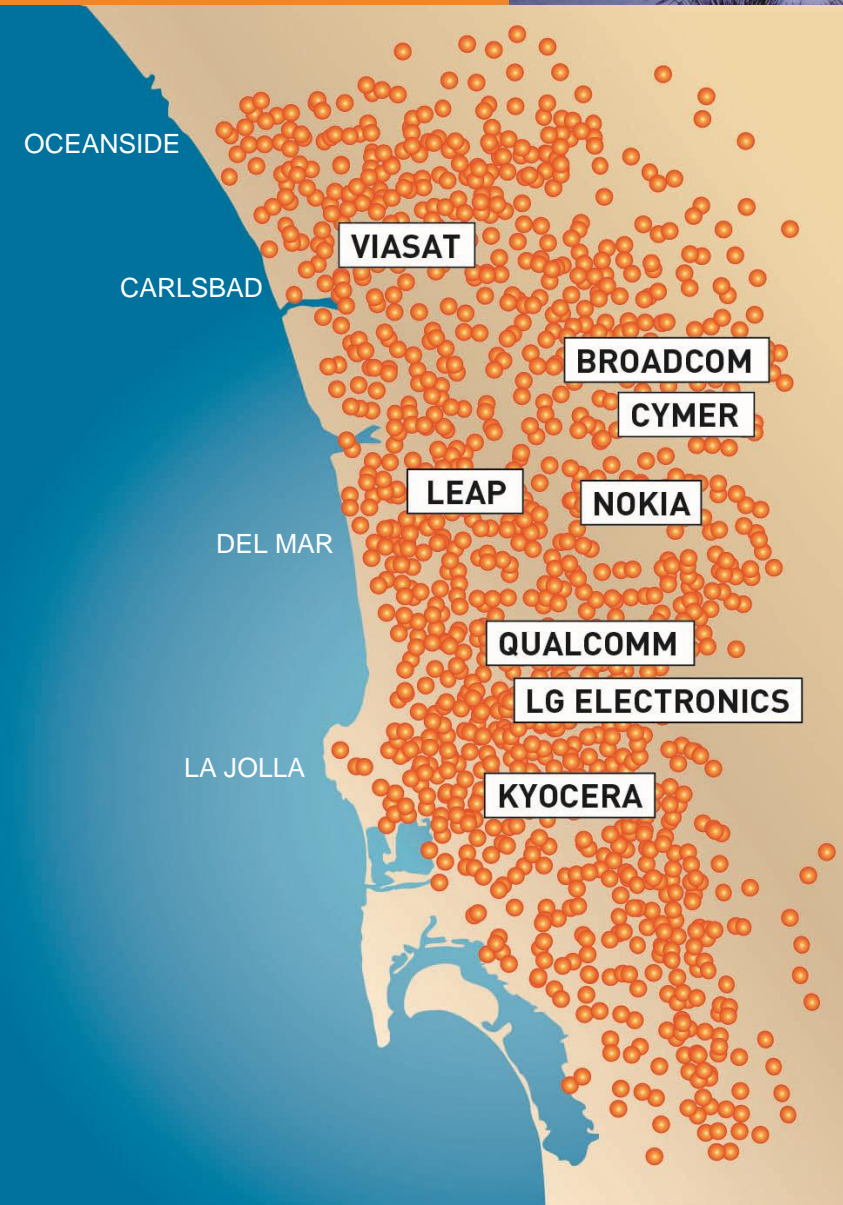
Today there are more than 260 Defense and Security Companies operating in San Diego.

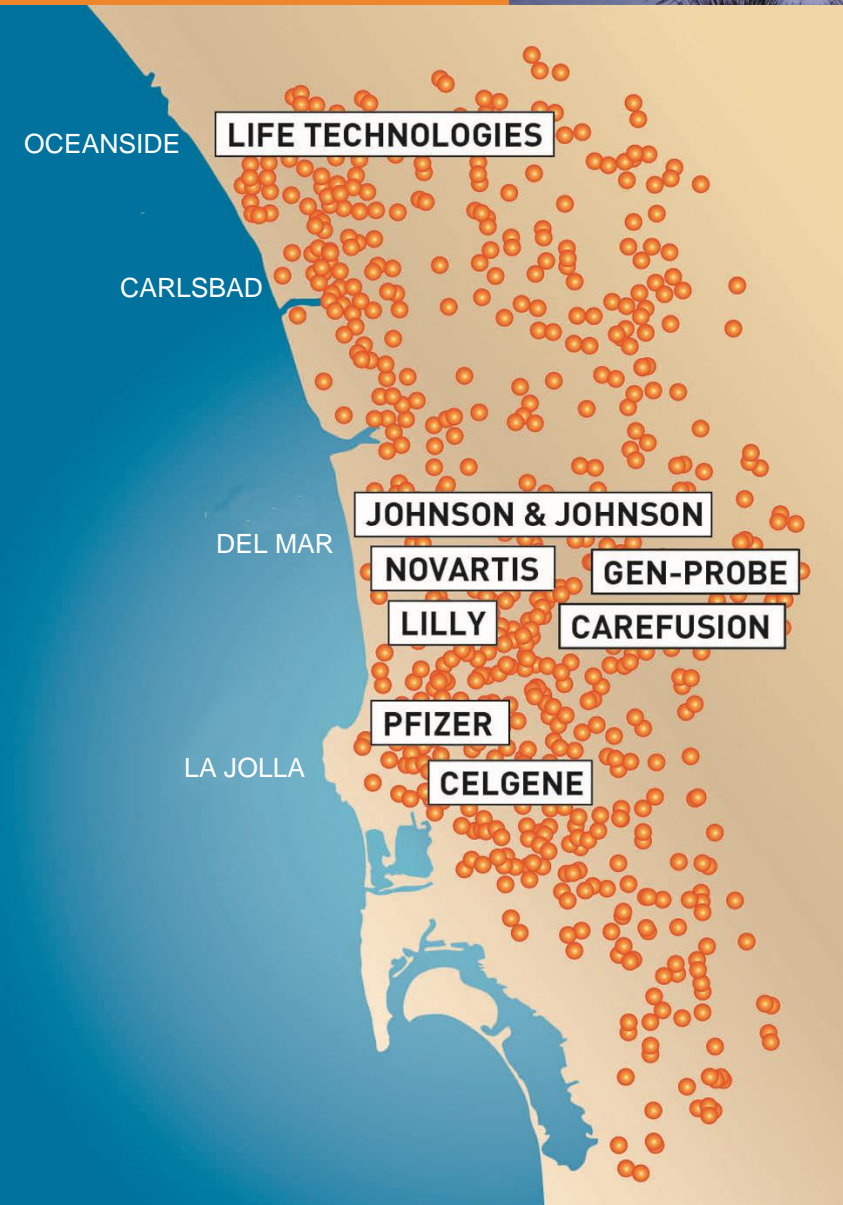


IT / Wireless / Software

Today there are more than 3000 IT, Wireless and Software Companies operating in San Diego.

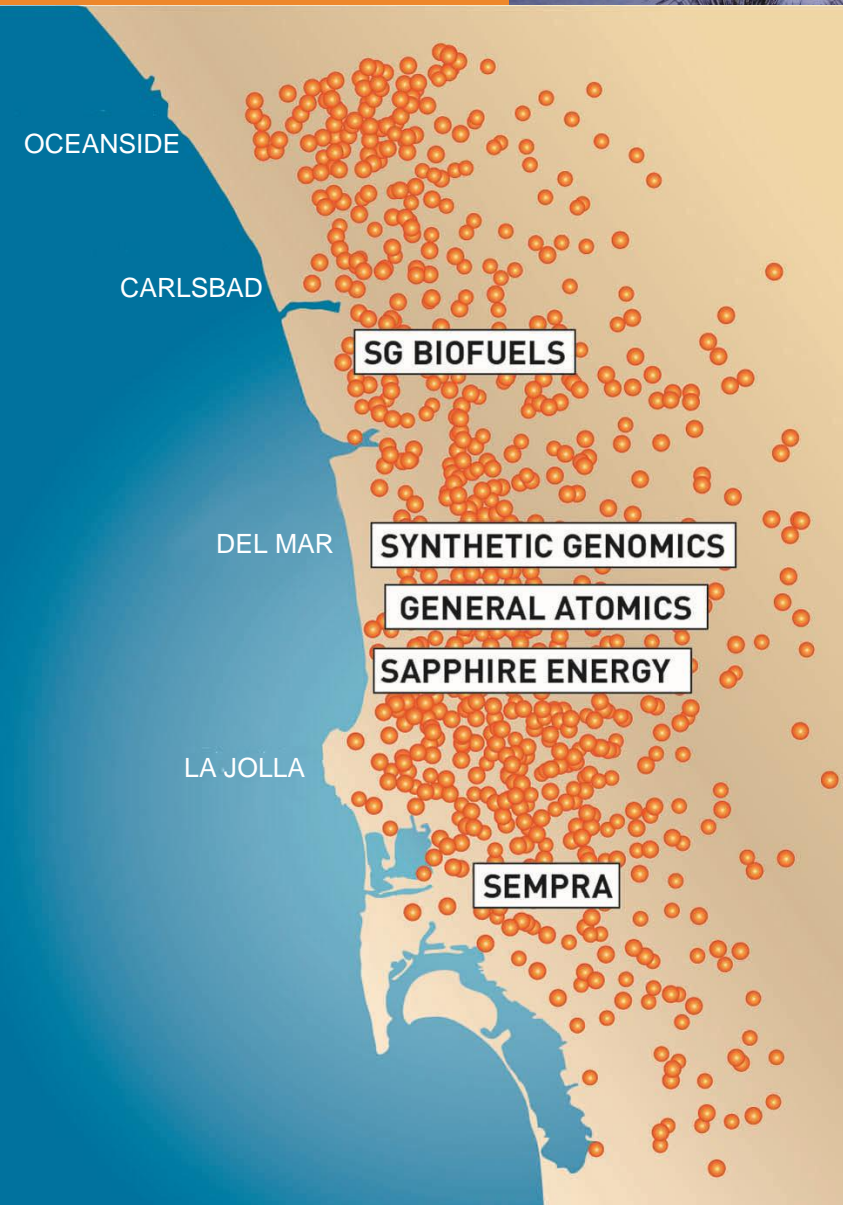




Life Sciences/Biomedical

Hybritech was founded in 1978 by UC San Diego professors Ivor Royston and Howard Birndorf as the first “BioTech” Company in San Diego.

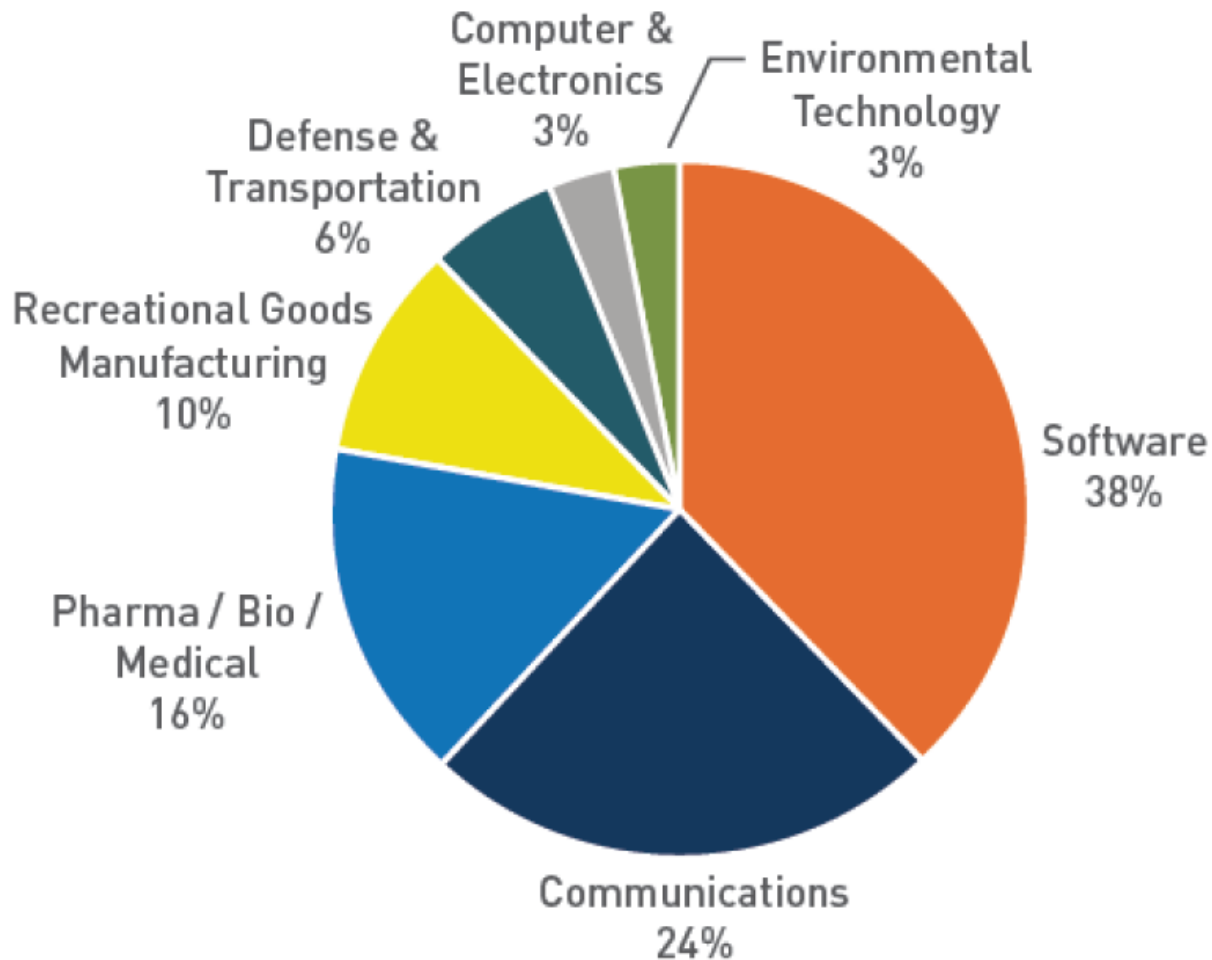

SAN DIEGO START-UPS BY INDUSTRY – 1ST Quarter 2011

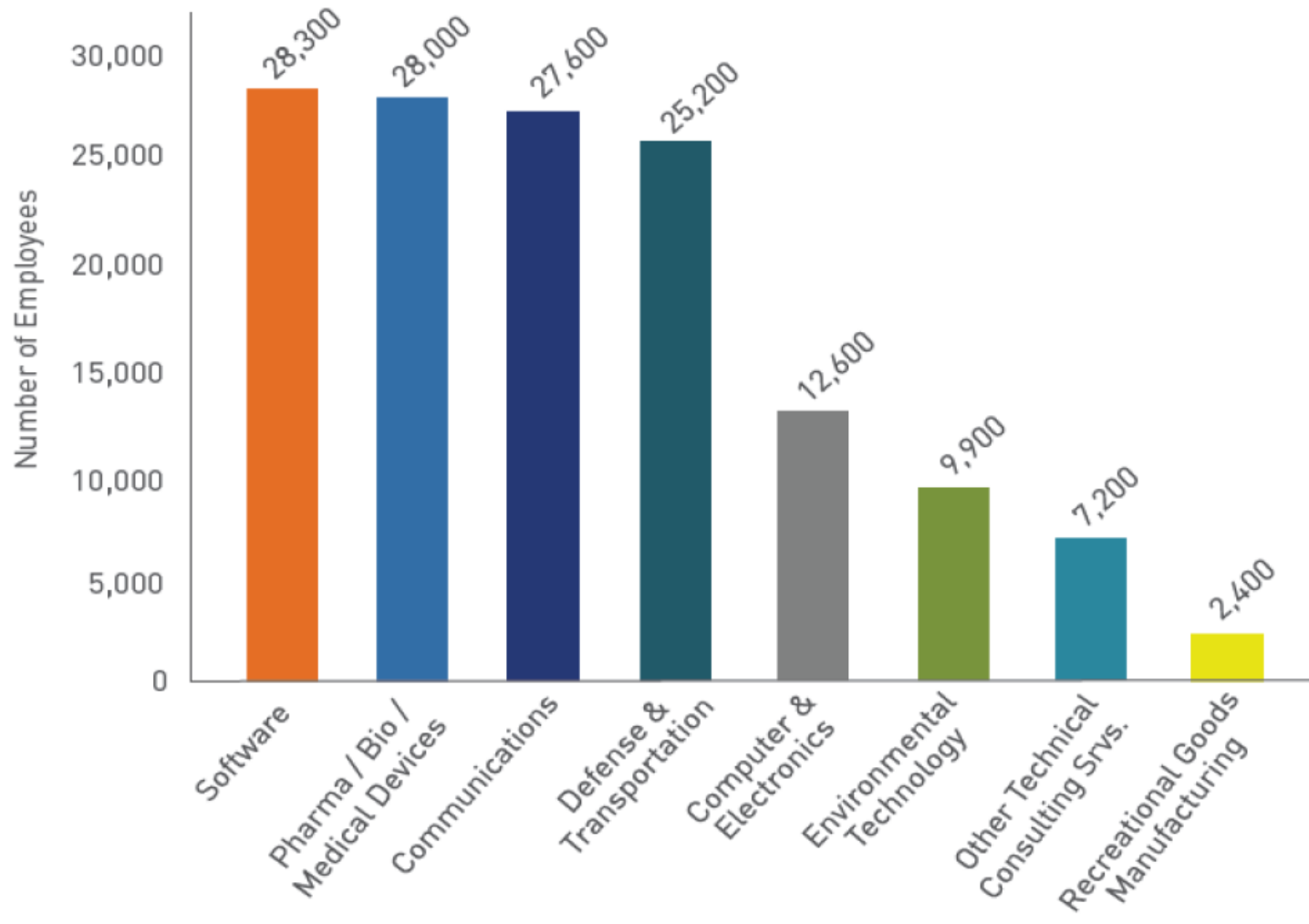

SAN DIEGO TECH EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY – 1ST Quarter 2011

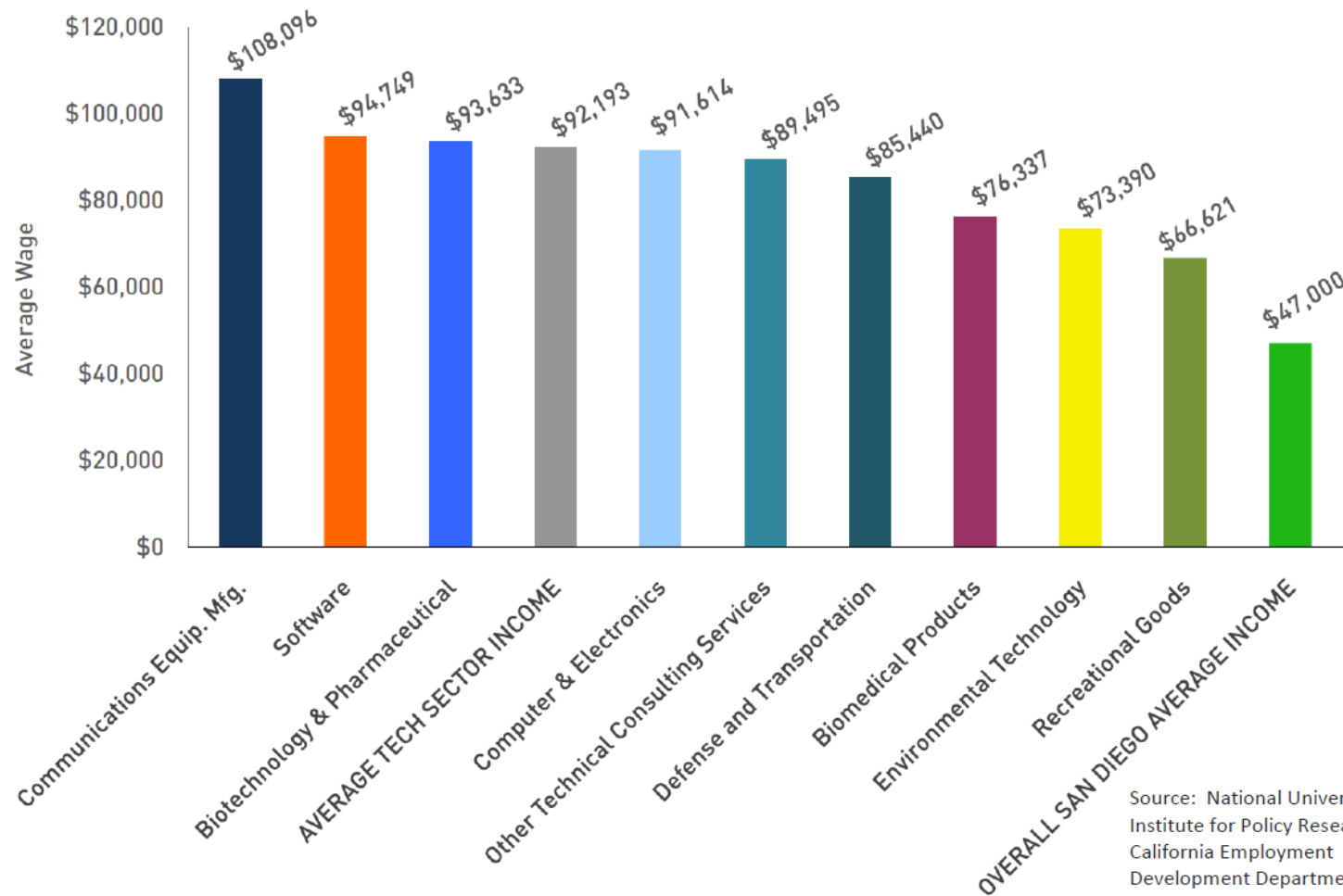

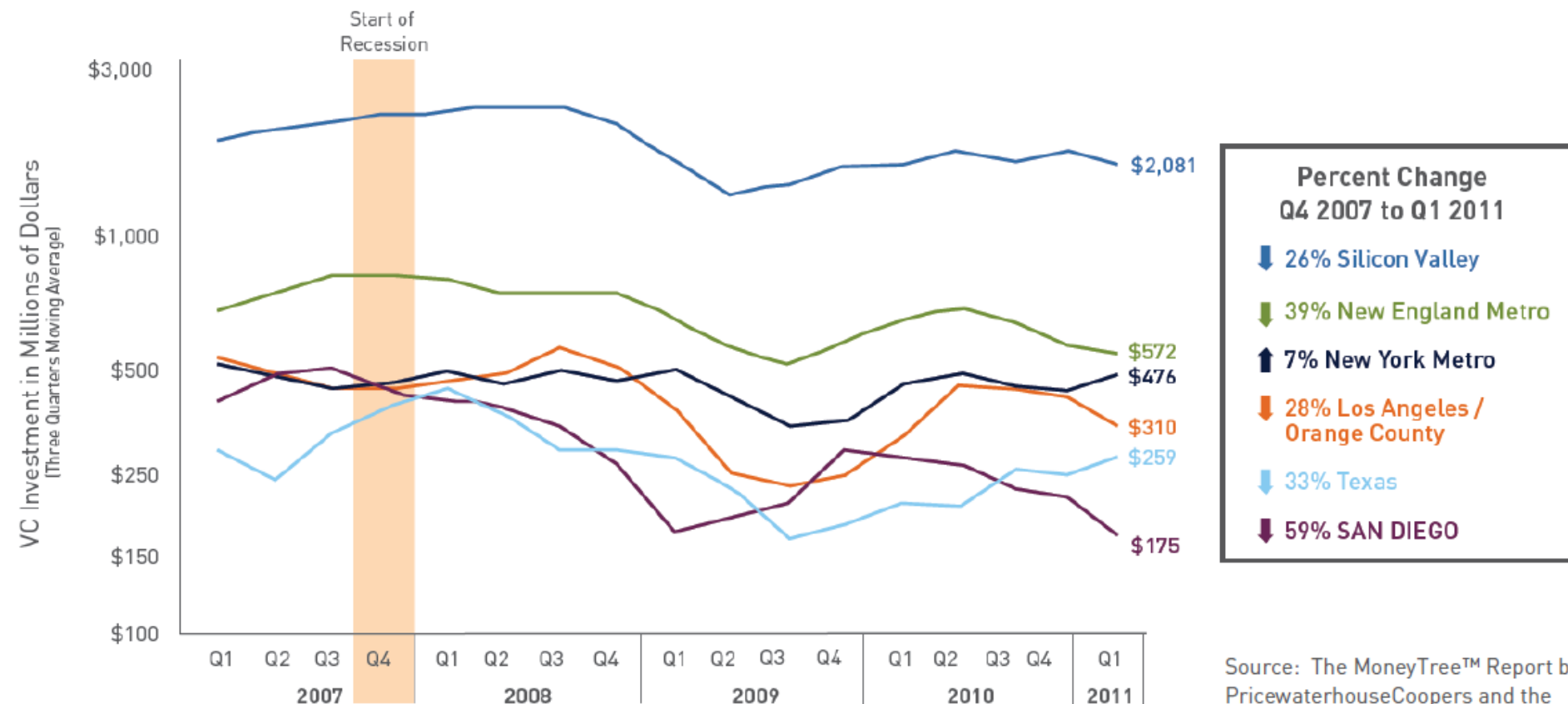
SAN DIEGO AVERAGE TECH SECTOR WAGES BY INDUSTRY

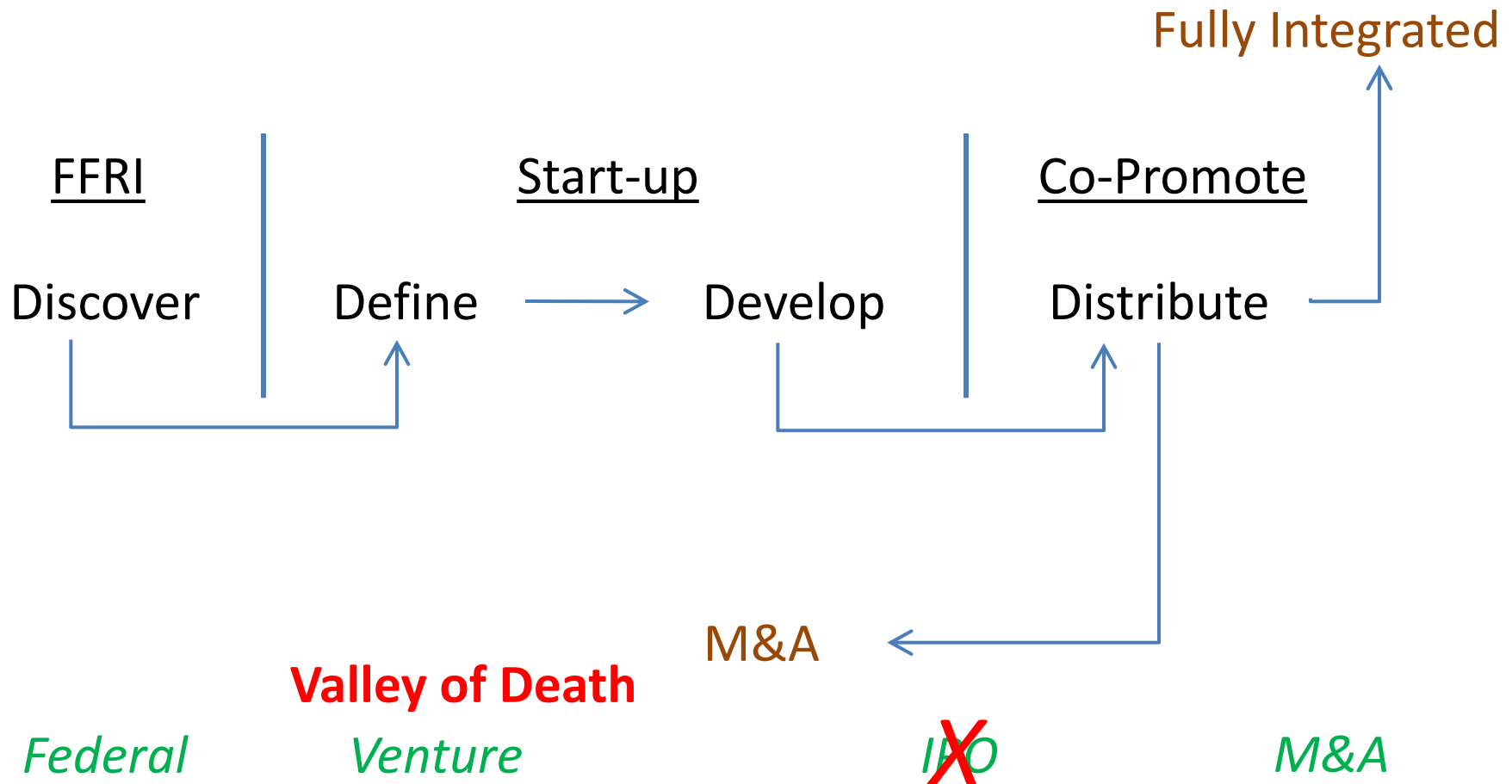

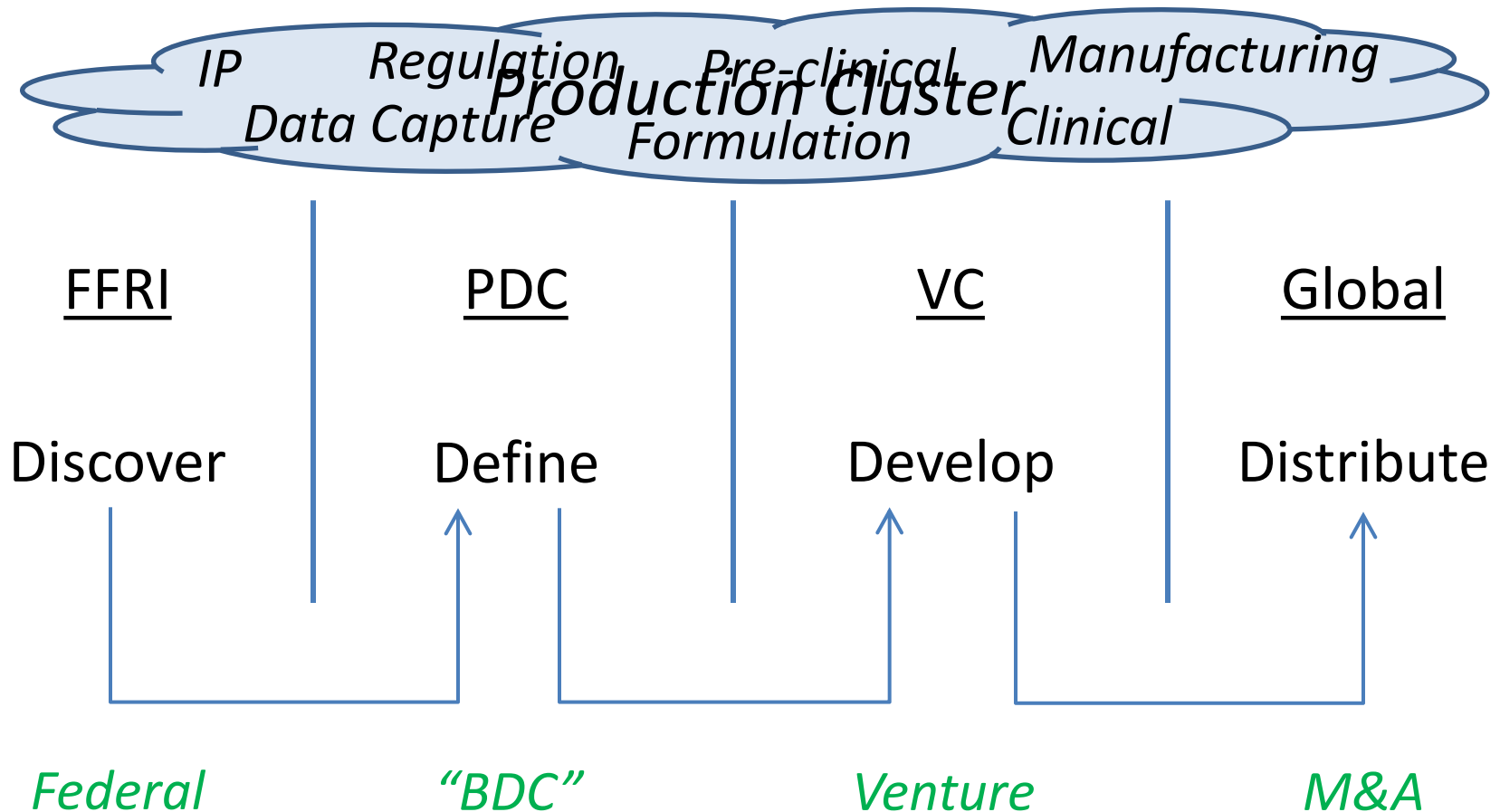


The Co-Partnering Model



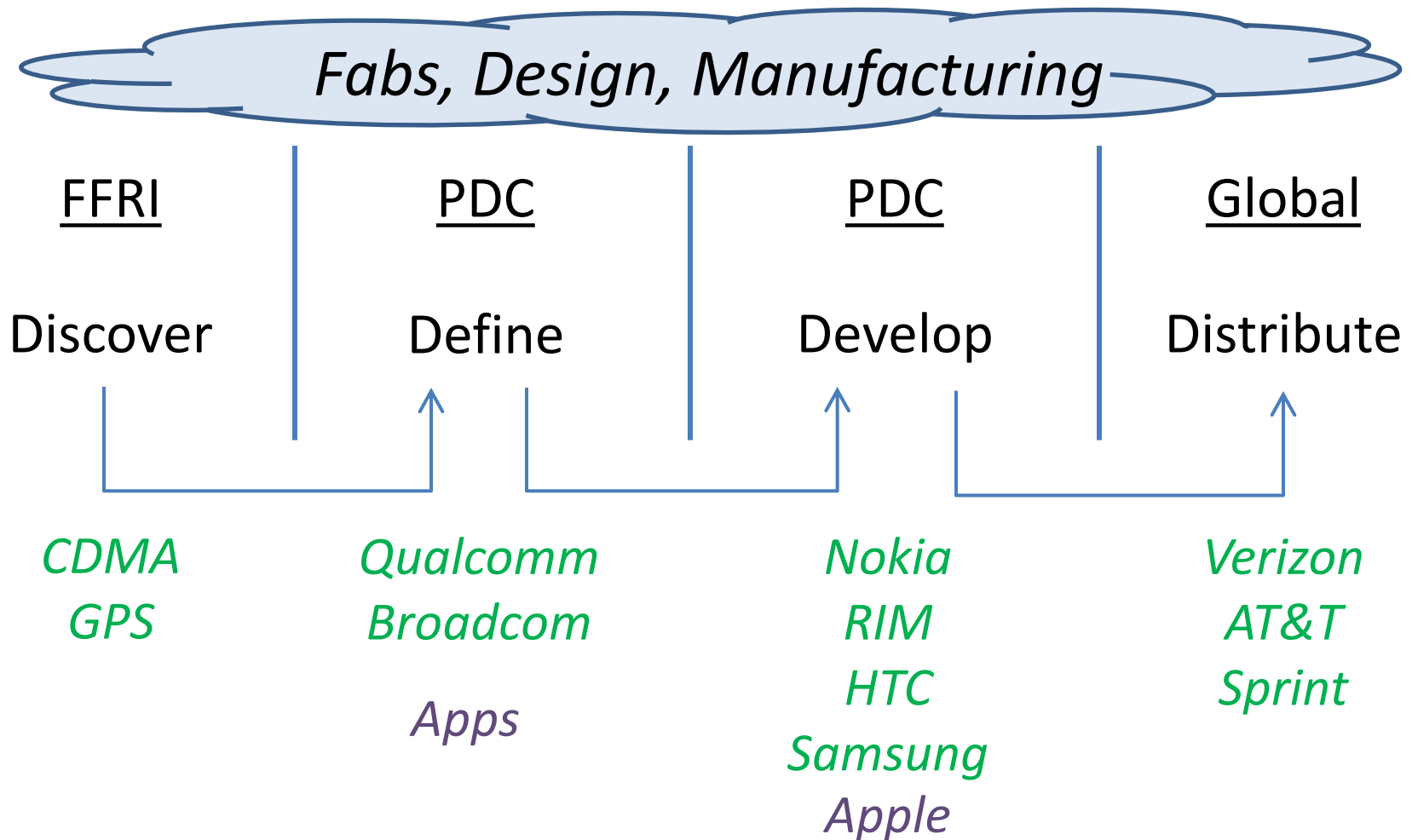


The Distributed Partnering Model
