

APТИP has a significant track record of improving student achievement.

APТИP replicates a program that began in 10 Dallas ISD schools in 1996. That program has produced dramatic results.

AP exams passed in math, science, and English in 10 DISD incentive schools




AP passing scores in math, science and English have increased 11 times in 15 years in participating DISD schools.

2011 APTIP Results – Highlights

- § Despite being in 1% of the U.S. schools, last year we had 6.9% of the US increase in passing MSE scores, 4.7% of the US' passing minority MSE scores, and an estimated 6.1% of the US passing math and science scores among females.
- § We have had a profound impact on the increases in the 6 states. On average, last year, our schools had a
 - § 51.4% of the state's increase in passing MSE Exams
 - § 55.6% of the state's increase in passing MSE Exams for minorities
 - § 55.6% of the state's increase in passing MSE Exams for low income students
 - § 45.7 of the state's increase in passing math and science Exams for females
- § Our first cohort had a 3-year 124% MSE increase with a 138% increase in math and science.
- § Our first cohort had a 3-year minority 216% MSE increase with a 193% increase in math and science.
- § Our first cohort had a 3-year female increase in math and science of 144% increase.
- § Our newest cohort, after just one year had an 89% MSE increase with a 106% increase in math and science.
- § Our newest cohort, after just one year had a minority 135% MSE increase with a 128% increase in math and science.
- § Our newest cohort, after just one year had an 126% math and science increase for female students.



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
