Description: The Federal Demonstration Partnership (FDP) has joined with a coalition of federal agencies to develop a common, voluntary data platform to facilitate the exchange of ideas, locate individuals with special knowledge and skills, and advance a common understanding of scientific investments. This data platform will be called the Science Experts Network and Curriculum Vitae (SciENCv).

SciENCv is a Science platform that will create value for researchers, funding agencies, and research institutions by providing an automated and interactive approach to collecting information on researchers and their accomplishments. The initiative envisions using existing efforts such as ORCID (Open Researcher & Contributor ID <http://orcid.org>) and Federated ID as components of a solution.

ORCID is an open registry of unique, persistent identifiers for scholars and their research-associated metadata. Integration into publishing and grant application workflows will ensure that data are current, authoritative, will automate linkages between scholars and their documents, and will streamline current individual-level efforts to maintain CV and biosketch information. SciENCv is a Science Experts Network and CV system that will provide a centralized, interactive platform for researchers to maintain up-to-date information on employment, education, grants, papers, publications, patents and all other contributions to the scientific enterprise. SciENCv will serve as a vehicle for enabling discovery about researcher expertise and professional accomplishments, while supporting the analysis of the long-term impacts of scientific research. As part of a federal wide effort to streamline application and reporting procedures, SciENCv ultimately will reduce administrative burden for federal grant submission and reporting requirements. SciENCv is a pilot program sponsored by the FDP and the NSTC's Research Business Models and Science of Science Policy interagency working groups and is part of the STAR METRICS program.
