- Merit Review Criteria Working Group: meeting regularly to discuss implementation plans
- Federal Register Notice published May 25, 2012
  - comments were due on July 12, 2012
- Comments were reviewed and resolved
  - Feedback, overall, was very favorable to the proposed implementation
- Proposed PAPPG language has been finalized and briefed to NSF Senior Management

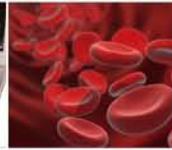

# Cost Sharing Update

- As recommended by the National Science Board and implemented by NSF, inclusion of voluntary committed cost sharing is prohibited in solicited & unsolicited proposals, unless approved in accordance with agency policy.
- Only 6 programs have been approved to require cost sharing:
  - Major Research Instrumentation Program (MRI);
  - Robert Noyce Scholarship Program;
  - Engineering Research Centers (ERC);
  - Industry/University Cooperative Research Centers (I/UCRC);
  - Experimental Programs to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR); and
  - Innovation Corps (I-Corps)



# Cost Sharing Update – Facilities, Equipment & Other Resources

- Provide a comprehensive description of all resources (**both physical and personnel**) necessary for, and available to the project
- No reference to cost, date of acquisition, and whether the resources are currently available or would be provided upon receipt of award

- Solicitations are being carefully scrubbed to ensure compliance with NSF's cost sharing policy.
- Next version of the Proposal & Award Policies & Procedures (PAPP) Guide will include a revision to the Facilities, Equipment & Other Resources section, to clarify what should be included.
- FastLane has been modified to address issue of PI time on budget.
- Anticipated issuance of the next PAPPG is October 2012, and effective January 2013

# COI Policy and Upcoming Changes

- NSF's COI Policy has long required that institutional policies include arrangements for keeping NSF's Office of the General Counsel appropriately informed if the institution finds that it is unable to satisfactorily manage a conflict of interest.
- The upcoming PAPPG will include a revision to our COI policy that specifies the process that will be used by the NSF Office of the General Counsel when they are notified that the institutional is not able to satisfactorily manage a conflict of interest.
