This guidance combined all of the OMB circulars on Federal financial assistance including A-21, A-110 and A-133 that specifically impact the cost principles, administrative requirements and audits for Federally sponsored research at our institutions. Universities individually and collectively through higher education organizations such as the Council on Governmental Relations (COGR) have been working feverishly to analyze the 244 page document to identify significant changes from the current guidance contained in the current circulars and to formulate a response to the notice requesting comments within the coming months. There appear to be both promising and worrisome revisions. Undoubtedly, our institutions will have a daunting task ahead of us when the final guidance is issued to revise policies and procedures. This session will provide an overview of the Guidance and its implications for the future of research administration.	Regency BC
