# Demonstration criteria

- Work-life Balance focus
  - Alignment with NSF policies within the foundation
  - Suggested role for FDP is to aggregate, curate, and evaluate the use of a library of best practices
  - Use resources as a mechanism for institutions to prepare proposals that show how they are adhering to these goals

# Demonstration activities proposed

- Identifying best practices for work life balance initiatives at universities
- Assess how universities can connect with the inter-agency harmonization that is already happening with the use of pathways approaches for supporting balance in areas like dependent care and dual career hiring
- Assessing with the FDP institutions (beginning with pipeline committee perspectives) how pathways resources, like training modules, could be leveraged at home institutions to build a culture of support for the goals of the work/life balance initiatives specifically and Title IX in general
- Develop a method to gather information about what institutions are doing to reflect adoption of Title IX
- Identify uses for tool kits to support policy development within institutions, reporting rubrics for tracking and evaluating the effectiveness of the policies, to support investigators to develop training programs, improve their effectiveness, and report outcomes
