	<p>Uniform Guidance: What Researchers Need to Know</p> <p>Topic: Research administrators are busy analyzing the Uniform Guidance which will become effective December 26, 2014 and assessing whether the revised principles will require changes to institutional policies, procedures and practices. The FDP Faculty Workload Survey II affirmed that Federally-funded principal investigators are still spending 42% of their research time devoted to administrative tasks associated with those awards. Time will tell if the Uniform Guidance (2 CFR 200) will offer any demonstrable relief or exacerbate the burden. However, some changes will clearly have a direct impact on Principal Investigators and it is not too soon to make your researchers aware of the anticipated changes.
