

PEER Awards to Date

PEER Science

Cycle 1

- -488 proposals from 63 countries
- -41 grants, \$5.5 million to support projects in 25 countries

Cycle 2

- -237 proposals from 54 countries
- -54 awards, \$7.5 million to support projects in 32 countries

• Cycle 3

- -258 proposals from 50 countries
- -Tentative: 39 awards, \$6.1 million to support projects in 23 countries

PEER Health

Cycle 1

- -186 proposals from 26 countries
- -16 grants, \$6.4 million to support projects in 10 countries

Cycle 2

- -30 proposals from 2 countries
- Tentative: 5 grants, \$2 million to support projects in Indonesia and the Philippines
