## Leg Update - GRANT Act

- Grant Reform and New Transparency Act of 2013
- HR 3316 Introduced October 23, 2013 in House on by Representative Lankford (OK)
- Co-Sponsored by Reps. Issa and Walberg
- Still in Committee (Mark-up)
- Key Provisions:
  - Requires Merit-Based Selection Procedures
  - Established Pre-Award Evaluation Requirements



# Leg Update - GRANT Act

- Key Transparency Provisions (continued)
  - Publicly posting the following information on awarded grants:
    - Executed grant agreement, including the terms and conditions
    - Copy of proposal, application, or plan, and subsequent amendments to the proposal, application, or plan
    - Documentation on the basis for selection and the numerical ranking of proposal if rankings were assigned.



# Leg Update - GRANT Act

- Key Transparency Provisions (continued)
  - Publicly posting the following performance information:
    - Final report or other final written product required under the grant terms
    - Other data or related results of the grant...that the agency considers of value to future researchers or the public interest



## Leg Update - DATA Act

- Digital Accountability and Transparency Act of 2013
- HR 2061 Introduced May 21, 2013 in House on by Representative Issa (CA)
- Passed by House on November 18, 2013
- Companion Legislation S.994 Introduced by Sen. Warner
- Senate version still in Committee

# Leg Update - DATA Act

- From the House Report:

*“Recovery.gov has demonstrated better accuracy and relevance than USASpending.gov. Its recipient-reported data has proved more useful for government-wide oversight than USASpending’s data. First, Recovery.gov’s recipient-supplied reports are received quarterly, permitting activity to be tracked across time...Second, the recipients of stimulus grants, contracts, and loans have a strong incentive to report under ARRA, because they run the risk of listing their stimulus funding if they do not.”*



# Leg Update - DATA Act

- Key Transparency Provisions
  - Expands the FFATA Act
  - Reduce reporting requirements by automating and consolidating financial reporting across the government
  - Creates pilot program to evaluate consolidated recipient reporting
    - Grantees/contractors with over \$1 billion in awards
    - Display full cycle of Federal funds
    - Improve accuracy of Federal financial data



# Leg Update - DATA Act

- Key Transparency Provisions (Continued)
  - Treasury will establish government-wide financial data standards for federal funds in consultation with public and private stakeholders
  - Expands sources from which USASpending.gov will incorporate data, including the Payment Automation Manager and Financial Information Repository
  - Established standard award identifiers



# Additional Transparency Issues

- **Animal Welfare Issues**
  - Do current Agency transparency systems adequately protect researchers working with animals?
  - How does your institution balance the need for transparency on animal welfare against the public right to understand how funds are spent?
  - Does pending legislation or other Federal initiatives cause concern in this area?



# Additional Transparency Issues

- Intellectual Property
  - Do current Agency transparency systems adequately protect intellectual property?
  - Does pending legislation or other Federal initiatives cause concern in this area?



# Additional Transparency Issues

- Dual Use Research
  - Do current Agency transparency systems cause concern about dual use research?
  - Does pending legislation or other Federal initiatives cause concern in this area?
