- Building Bridges between Academic Institutions and Professional/Scientific Societies
- Addressing the Broader Harms of Sexual Harassment: A Community Perspective
- Tackling and Preventing Incivility and Gender Harassment

Concurrent Sessions

These sessions will focus on innovative work currently being implemented, potential approaches that are being explored but are not yet planned or actualized, and unaddressed areas where brainstorming or development needs to be done. Potential Concurrent Sessions topics may include:

- Transparency in Communicating Findings of Responsibility and Administrative Action
- Working Collectively to Tackle the “Pass the Harasser” Problem
- Reintegrating Targets into Research and Academic Spaces: During and After an Investigation
- Supporting Targets and Preventing Retaliation
- Creative Solutions for Reducing the Power Differential between Advisors and Trainees
- Remediating Situations with Power Differential or Power Dependence
- Considering Behavior in Promotion and Tenure Decisions
- Considerations for Unique Ecosystems within Higher Education and What to Consider when Scaling Promising Practices
- Taking into Account the Sexual Harassment Experiences of Individuals with Intersecting Identities
- Approaches for Evaluating and Researching how the Response System is Working for Targets
- Evaluation the Effectiveness of Sexual Harassment Interventions
