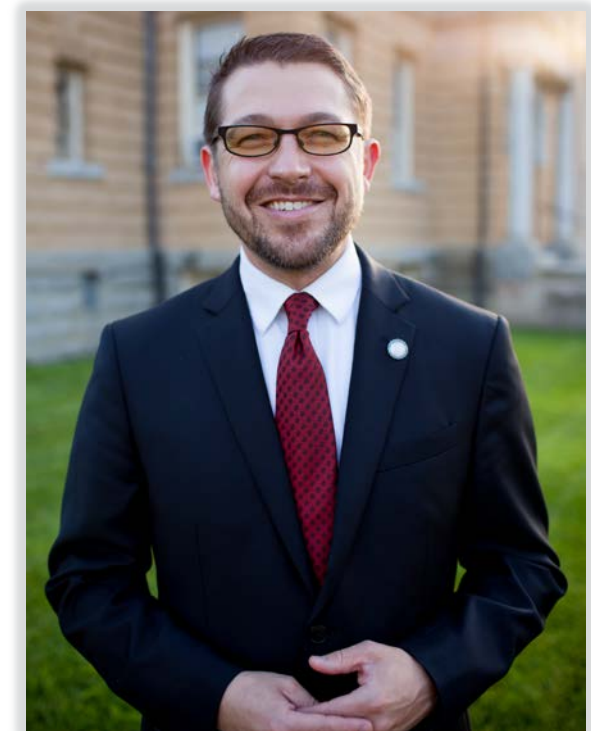

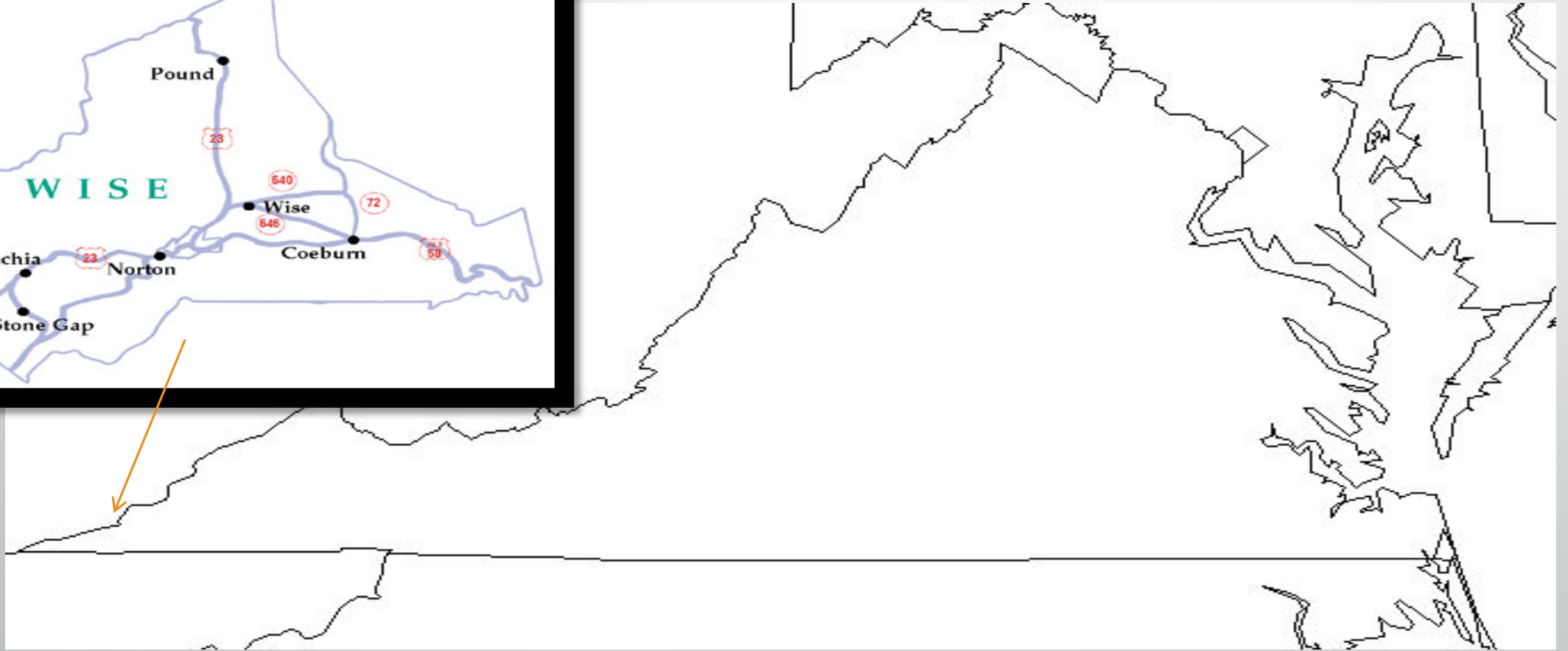
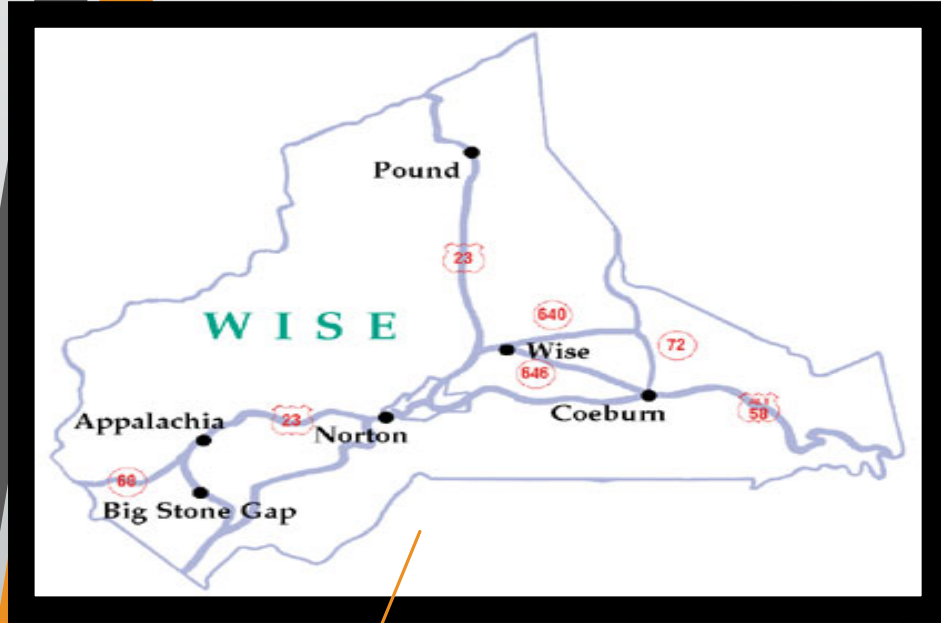

# STATUTORY DUTIES

"The attorney for the Commonwealth . . . shall be a part of the department of law enforcement of the county or city in which he is elected or appointed, and shall have the duties and powers imposed upon him by general law, including the duty of prosecuting all warrants, indictments or informations charging a felony, and he may in his discretion, prosecute Class 1, 2 and 3 misdemeanors, or any other violation, the conviction of which carries a penalty of confinement in jail, or a fine of \$500 or more, or both such confinement and fine. He shall enforce all forfeitures, and carry out all duties imposed upon him by § 2.2-3126."

Virginia Code § 15.2-1627

# ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING PROGRAMS?

- Prison/Jail Incarceration?
- Drug Court?
- Treatment?
- Work Release?
- Weekend Jail?
- Community Service?

***Alternative Sentencing Programs include community service programs that allow low-level, low-risk offenders the opportunity to complete community service in lieu of incarceration and give back to the communities they have harmed.***



# What Offenders Qualify?

- Low-Level Offenders with petty crimes. These crimes can include simple drug possession, Driving Under the Influence( 1<sup>st</sup> offense), probation violations, low-level distribution offenses, etc.
- Low-Risk Offenders with no violent criminal charges or any violent criminal history.
- Offenders must be in good health and able to complete physical labor requirements.
- Offenders must also remain drug free.





# What types of community service will be completed?

Participants will complete:

- Litter Pick Up
- Mowing (all types of grounds work)
- Painting
- Construction
- Soup kitchen
- Animal care
- Food Banks
- Etc.





# Where will this community service work be completed?

# Benefits to the Participants & Their Families

- Participants learn new job skills that will allow them to gain employment
- Participants have access to recovery related treatment that gives them the tools to get sober and remain drug free
- Participants give back to their communities by completing hours of community service throughout the local area that would otherwise not get done





# Benefits to the Participants & Their Families (continued)

- Participants get to remain out of jail in the home with their families
- Participants that have children get to continue providing care for those children that would otherwise fall on family members or the Department of Social Services
- Participants that have children also maintain a home environment of stability in an effort to prevent MEB disorders and promote healthy development
- Participants are given structure and held accountable for their actions
- Participants can complete extra community service work to pay off court costs and fines
- The court system works with participants to help them regain their driver's license
- Participants learn the skills it takes to become a productive citizens in their communities

- Many graduates have gone on to obtain full time employment.
- Several current participants have obtained full or part time employment along with their community service requirements.
- Some are being considered for employment opportunities at their current worksites once they have completed their program requirements.

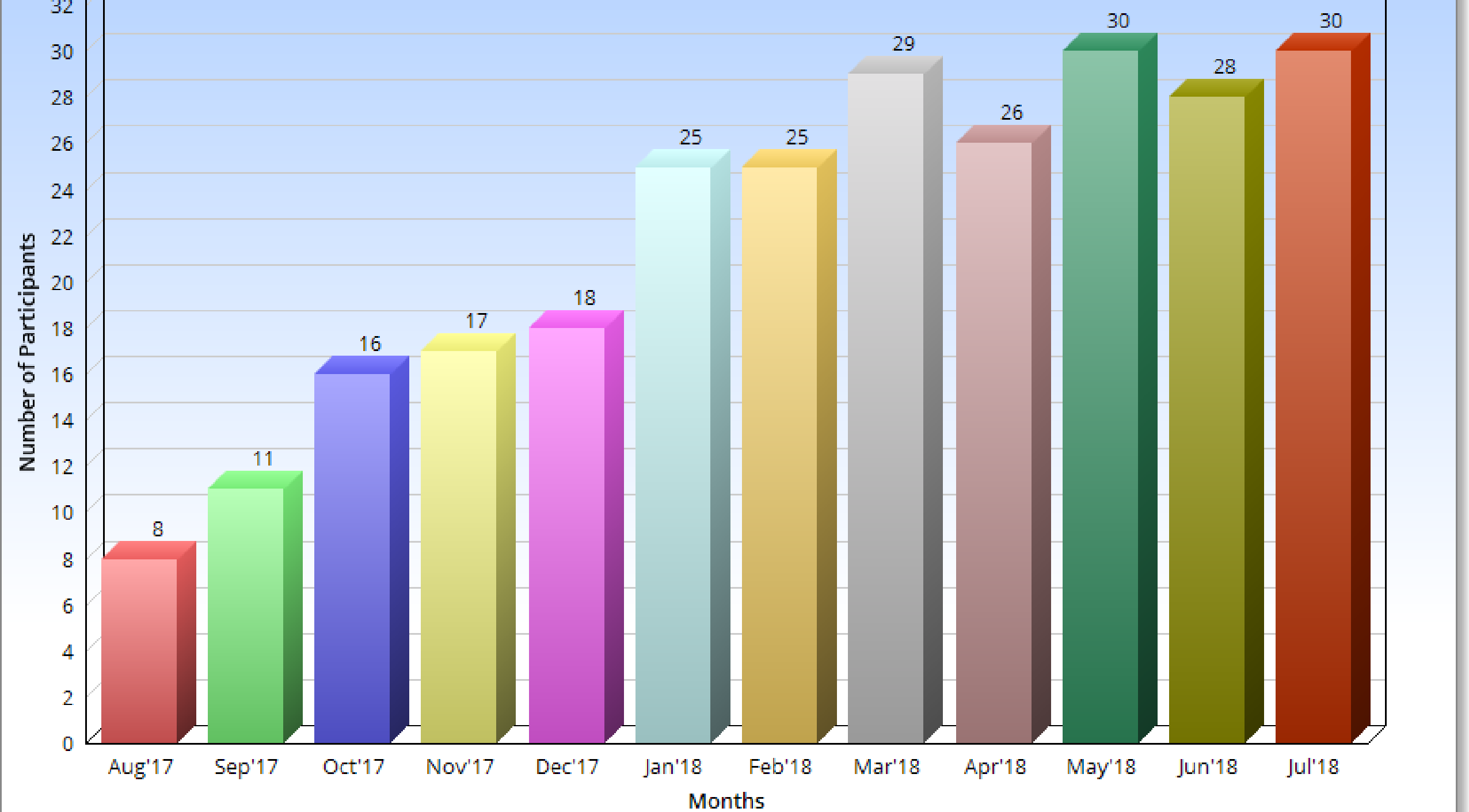
STUDIES HAVE SHOWN THAT

THUS CUTTING DOWN ON  
RECIDIVISM.

# THE RESULTS

Current stats as of April 2019:

- 67 participants since the program began
- 12 graduates thus far
- 8 removed participants
- 25 current active participants
- Over 2,000 hours worked by each participant at localities and non-profits
- 25 different job sites





Successful completion rate:

63.15%

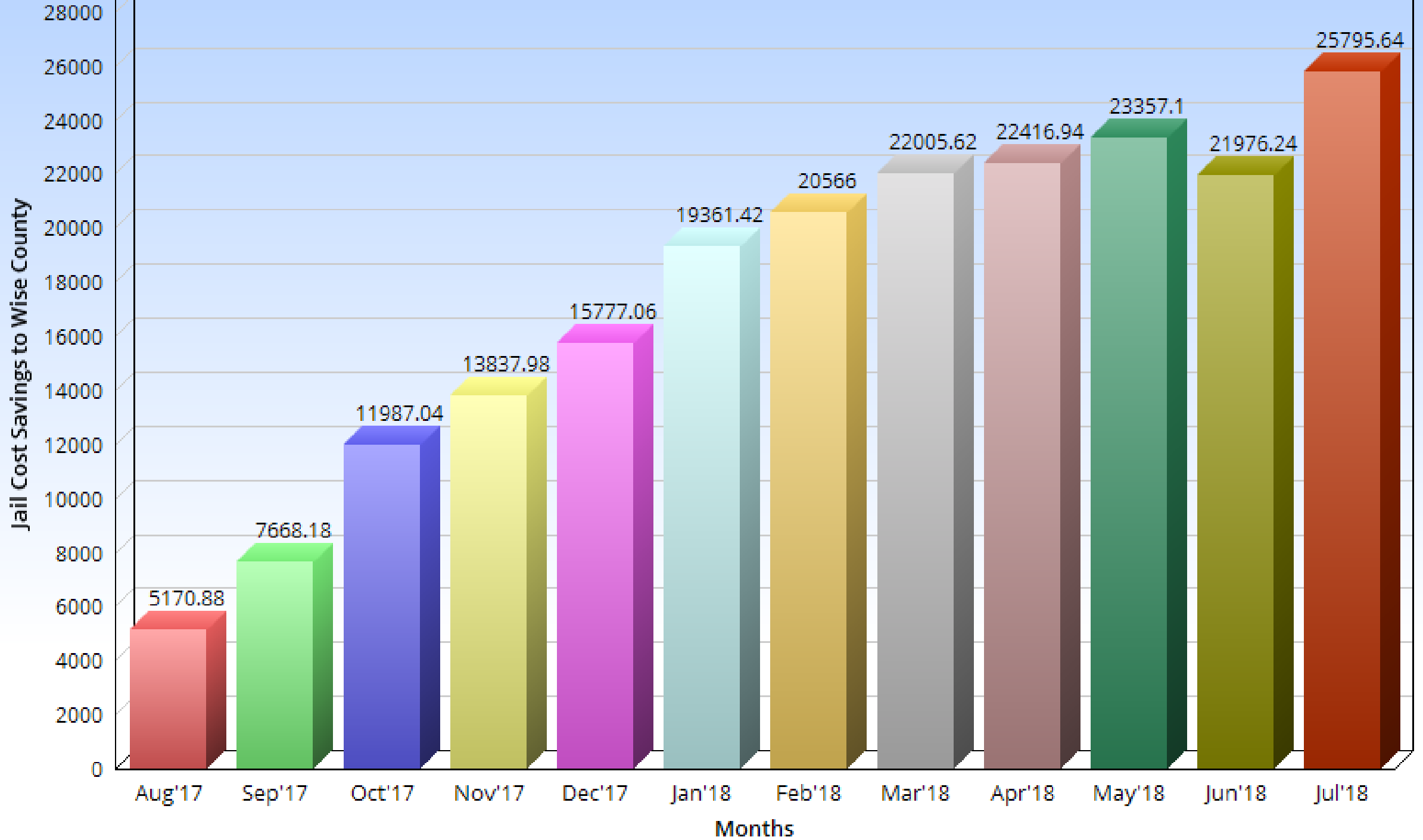




# THE RESULTS

- **16,680** combined days out of jail for participants
- A total of **\$425,334.26** in jail cost savings to Wise County
- In 18+ months, the program has saved our area almost **\$500,000**.
- Last quarter, the jail credited about half of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter payment back to Wise County: an amount of roughly **\$340,000**.

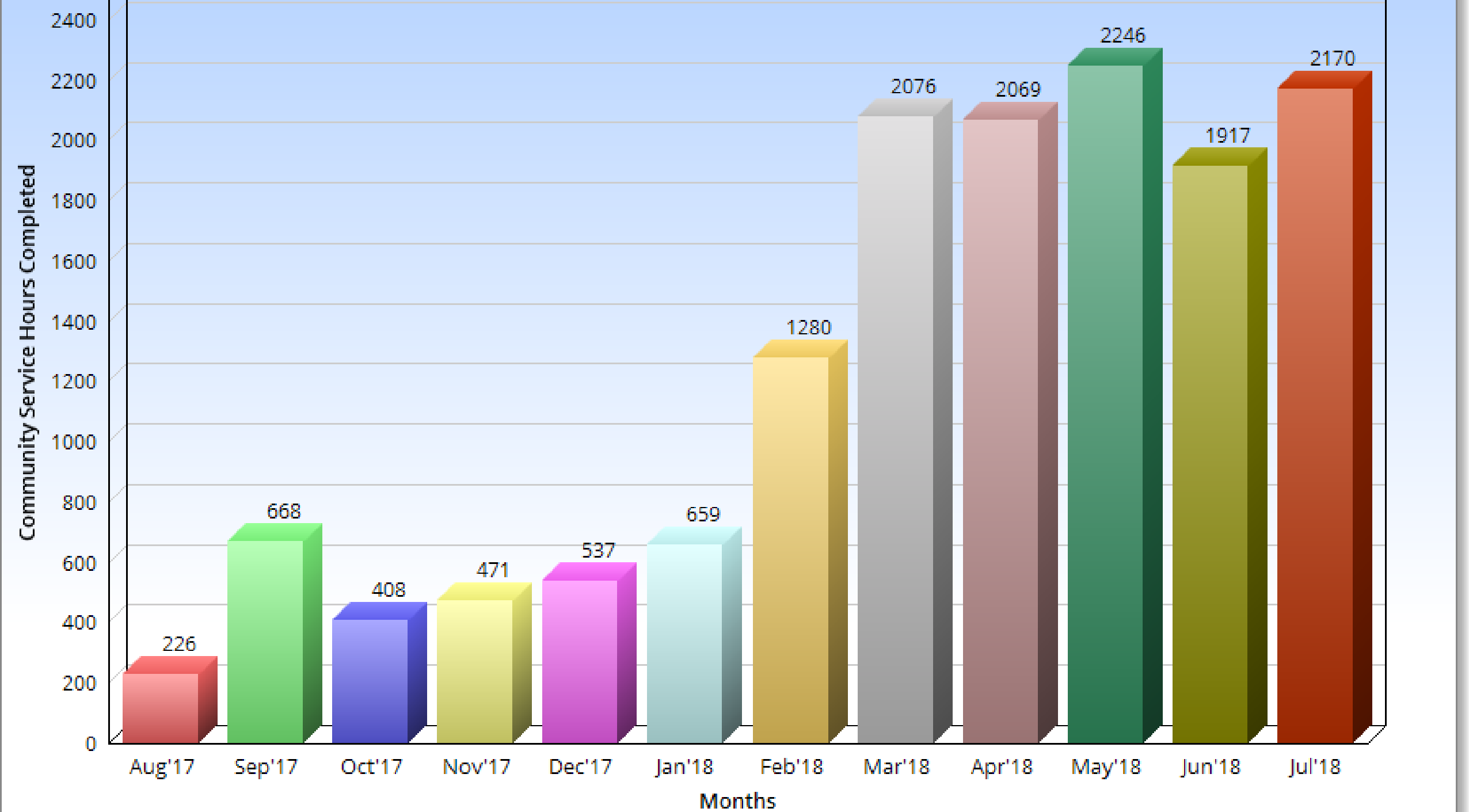




## THE RESULTS

- A total of 30,322 hours of community service has been completed in Wise County.
- Those community service hours equate to a total of \$235,037.75 in labor/cost savings for Wise County.







# TOTAL SAVINGS TO WISE COUNTY (YEAR ONE)

● JAIL COST SAVINGS:	\$ 425,334.26
● LABOR SAVINGS:	\$ 235,037.75
● COURT COST AND FINES PAID:	\$ 2,262.00
● PROGRAM FEES COLLECTED:	\$ 535.00
TOTAL COMBINED SAVINGS:	\$ 663,169.01





## Other Accomplishments:

- The Wise Works Program was selected to take part in a lengthy series on the National Public Radio (NPR) Market Place, that will air later this year.
- The Wise Works Program has been the focus of many newspaper articles.
- The Wise Works Program has been contacted by several other localities throughout the state of Virginia about adding a similar alternative sentencing program to their counties.
