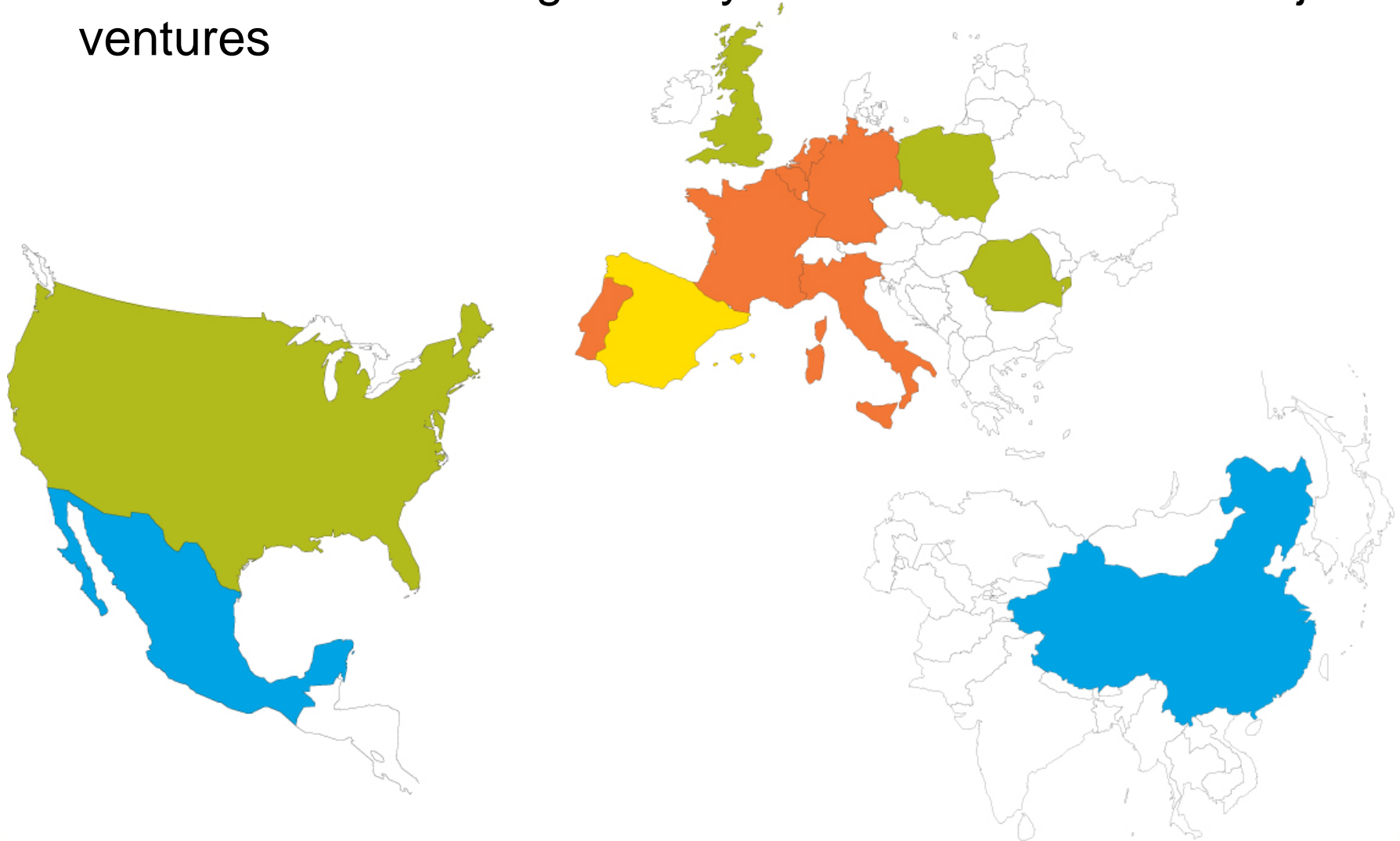

Reducing Greenhouse Gases

- BioEnergy Task Force
 - Capturing methane at processing plants
 - Pilot project to convert methane to electricity

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Animal Welfare Management Program

Created to:

- Ensure well-being of animals
- Ensure compliance with legal requirements
- Promote continual improvement
- Provide objective evidence of sound animal management

Credible and Auditable

- Widely recognized as the most comprehensive animal welfare management program in our industry, earning recognition from independent experts
- Drs. Stan Curtis, University of Illinois, and Temple Grandin, Colorado State University, involved in the development
- Utilizes Pork Quality Assurance Plus (PQA Plus)
 - Farm assessment protocol tool
 - Verified through random third-party audits

Credible and Auditable

- Trucker Quality Assurance program
- Live-haul accident response program
 - Centered on swift and humane action
 - New equipment and training
 - Applauded by emergency response workers and livestock handling experts

Continuous Improvement

Group Housing

- Phasing out gestation stalls at company-owned farms over the next 10 years in favor of group housing
- Customer-driven business decision driven by results of three-year study

CO₂ Stunning

- Expanded implementation of CO₂ stunning at processing facilities
 - Processes animals in groups, rather than single file
 - Viewed by animal experts as less stressful than traditional methods



Responsible Antibiotics Use

- Strictly limited and veterinarian-directed
- No routine, as defined by policy, administration of antibiotics used in human medicine to healthy animals
- Consulted with Compass Group and Environmental Defense on Compass Purchasing Policy
- Report pounds purchased per hundred weight sold annually

New Processing Plant in Kinston, N.C.

- Armor Inox Thermix™ system
 - Virtually eliminates need to touch products after meat is placed in casings
- Employee RFID tags ensure no cross contamination
- Separate slicing lines, drainage systems and dedicated air-handling units
