“The Four Pillars”





BFTDA Programs

The Ben Franklin Technology Partners (Capital)

- Seed capital, management and strategy support

University Research Grants (Innovation/Workforce)

- Funding for tech-transfer and workforce development focused on the nanotechnology and energy sectors

Technology Development Grants (Support Services)

- Highly flexible grant funding to address gaps in the continuum



BFTDA Strategic Programs...continued

Keystone Innovation Zones (Innovation/Workforce)

- Funding for designated geographies tied to Universities

Venture Investment Program (Capital)

- VC Fund of Funds to drive investment to companies emerging from the continuum




The continuum in action:



- \$30K start-up capital from **BFTP**
- \$250k to further commercialize Drexel tech from **URP**
- \$7K from **IP** helps 4 SBIRs
- \$90k+ pursuit of **KIZ** tax credit
- Pitching to **MAG II** angel fund anchored by BFTDA
- Series A conversations with **VC** network




BFTDA Annual Allocation: The ground has SHIFTED

Measuring the Success of the BFTDA



A process to make PA's tech-based measurements more accurate and accountable.

- Ensured that “job” counts were a direct result of BFTDA funding.
- Broadened what “success” means for TBED – more than jobs.
 - Commercialization
 - Leverage
 - Company formation
 - Intellectual Property and Licensing
 - Graduates and Job Placement
 - Employment and Employment Compensation

Why we took on this project?

- To bring “traditional” bricks and mortar up to speed with Commonwealth’s innovative TBED strategies
- To deliver a common platform from which PA’s entire TBED community can communicate about investments
- To cultivate additional political security through education
- To make PA a national leader in TBED measurements and investments
- To address increasing pressure to be accountable
- To define the mission and goals of various TBED programs/partners and ensure performance indicators reflect the goals
- To create alternative, valid, implementable performance indicators to more effectively examine investments and capture performance

Innovation Partnership

- Created in 2002 by PA's statewide TBED community
 - Focused on improving PA's SBIR/STTR "win" rate
 - Pre-proposal technical reviews
 - Micro-grants for preparation assistance and Phase II gaps
 - Training and education
- PA's win-rate is 20 % compared to the national average of 14 or 15 %

BFTDA Partners with Federal Programs



Partnership Intermediary Agreement (PIA)

- PA chosen as 1 of 8 partners to assist USDA in translating more research and intellectual property
- Benefits to BFTDA partners:
 - Access to research, research expertise and IP
 - Facilities and Equipment
 - Partnering and funding opportunities
 - Future access to DoD labs, research and IP
