What is CSWM?

The American Society for Microbiology (ASM) Committee on the Status of Women in Microbiology (CSWM) is a committee of the ASM Public and Scientific Affairs Board. The committee is made up of ASM members who are interested in career issues facing women microbiologists.

The committee's mission is to:

- ▶ advise ASM on matters concerning the status of women microbiologists
- ▶ collect data on the training and employment of women microbiologists
- ▶ encourage women microbiologists to participate in ASM activities.



What Does CSWM Do?

Highlighting Issues Important to Women in Science

Every year at the General Meeting, the CSWM conducts a **special interest session** on issues relevant to women in microbiology.

In addition, the Committee holds an **open business meeting** at the General Meeting to discuss issues and ongoing projects. All ASM members are welcome!

Networking

CSWM hosts an open **reception** at the General Meeting, immediately following the open business meeting. The reception is a great place to network with your colleagues in microbiology!

The **CSWM booth** in the convention center lobby is a great place to meet up with colleagues and get the latest information on the Special Interest Session, Reception, and other information of interest to women in microbiology.



The Alice C. Evans Award

Established by the ASM Committee on the Status of Women in Microbiology, the **Alice C. Evans Award** recognizes an individual for major



contributions toward the full participation of women in microbiology. The award is given in memory of Alice C. Evans, the first woman to be elected president (in 1928) of the Society of American Bacteriologists, now called the American Society for Microbiology.

The award consists of a plaque and travel to the ASM General Meeting, where the laureate and nominator are guests of honor at the reception hosted by the Committee on the Status of Women in Microbiology. In addition, the award laureate and nominator are honored guests at the ASM awards banquet.
