Roger Pfister is Head of the International Cooperation Department of both the Swiss Academy of Sciences (SCNAT) and the national umbrella organization, the Swiss Academies of Arts and Sciences. At the same time, and through the generous support of the SCNAT, he is the Executive Secretary for the International Council for Science's (ICSU) Committee on Freedom and Responsibility in the conduct of Science (CFRS).

By formation, he is a political scientist and international relations scholar. He did his graduate studies in contemporary history with a focus on Africa at the University of Berne, Switzerland, and at the Centre of West African Studies (CWAS), University of Birmingham, UK. He began his PhD at the Centre for International Studies (CIS) in Zurich, Switzerland, obtaining his degree from Rhodes University in Grahamstown, South Africa. In his doctoral thesis, he researched South Africa's apartheid foreign relations with sub-Saharan African states.

Following his studies, he was engaged in a network at the ETH Zurich that promoted the transfer of know-how to developing countries. Subsequently, in Fribourg, Switzerland, he directed the university's Department of Research Promotion. In that capacity, he was also involved in setting up social sciences research programmes in the Western Balkans and in the South Caucasus.

Roger Pfister has widely published on South Africa's post-Apartheid foreign policy, the diplomacy in exile of the African National Congress (ANC), and on the relevance of new information technologies for Africa.
